HIGHLY QUALIFIED STAFF

The New Vision Learning Academy will seek to meet and/or exceeded the criteria set by the State of Louisiana for highly qualified teachers.

All Paraprofessionals within the school have met the requirements for being highly qualified through passing the State Paraprofessional test or having the needed college credits.

PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW

The federal education law "No Child Left Behind, requires that all parents in a Title I school be notified and given the opportunity to request information about the professional qualifications of classroom teachers instructing their child and paraprofessionals that work with their child.

- Parents have the right to request information from the principal regarding the professional qualifications of their children's classroom teachers. This information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's classroom teachers include, at a minimum, the following:
 - Whether the teacher meets the state qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which he or she teaches.
 - Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status because of special circumstances.
 - The teacher's college major, whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree.
 - Whether paraprofessionals provide services to your child, and if so, their qualifications.
 - If at any time your child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not certified, the school will notify you.
- Parents have the right to know how well your child is doing in school. Parents will be provided information regarding their child's progress, results of any diagnostic report, and level of achievement on each of the state's academic assessments.
 - Standards detail what students are expected to know and what skills they should have.
 - Standards-based tests let parents, teachers, and communities see how well students are performing. Testing also helps educators evaluate which students and schools need extra help.
- Parents have the right to know if your child's school and the district is meeting the goals set by the state for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).
 - Schools that do not make Adequate Yearly Progress must develop improvement plans and take other actions to meet AYP requirements.
 - Annual District and State report cards on school performance are published to show parents and other members of the community how the school's performance compares to that of other schools in your district and state.

- Parents have the right to send your child to a safe school. The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) requires schools to report on school safety. Your child's school is working to keep students and teachers safe by enforcing laws and school policies. Safe and drug-free prevention plans at your child's school cover:
 - Security procedures
 - Codes of conduct for students and school staff
 - Discipline policies when codes of conduct are broken
 - An emergency or crisis management plan
- Procedures will be in accordance with the ESEA Federal, State, and Local Guidelines.

Title I is a federally funded program designed to improve educational opportunities by providing aid to elementary and secondary education. The intent of Title I is to expand learning opportunities while supplementing basic skills instruction in reading and math. TITLE I PROGRAM AT NEW VISION LEARNING ACADEMY

The Title I K-6 School-wide Program at New *Vision* Learning Academy has been designed to improve the educational success for all students enrolled within the program.

Based on the assumption that all children are capable of learning and that student achievement is in direct correlation to expectations set, the following goal has been set: to emphasize improved reading, math, and language arts outcomes by providing support to students in these areas as higher standards of learning *are* implemented.

The Title I program is designed to reach as many students as possible providing them with the opportunities and support needed to achieve higher standards of performance within the classroom.

Individual or small group help is provided to students who are "struggling" with a given concept - determined by the classroom teacher through the use of pre/post testing, daily work, and informal observations.

New Vision Learning Academy Title I Policy Guidelines for Parent Involvement

Philosophy of Parent Participation

- New Vision Learning Academy recognizes that parents are their children's first and most influential teachers.

- 3. Parents will be encouraged to assist in School-wide Title I projects such as planning and implementing them.
- 4. Timely information, materials and suggestions will be provided to help parents promote education of their children in their homes.
- 5. Copies of this policy will be available at the annual fall Open House/Parent Orientation and Meet the Teacher Night

Addendum to the New Vision Learning Academy Title I Parent Involvement Handbook:

New Vision Learning Academy

Title I Complaint Procedures

The parent should file the complaint with the Principal at the school site. Proceedings may terminate at any step on mutual agreement or upon complainant's satisfaction.

Informal

A person with a complaint about the Title 1 Program and/or its implementation in the district should file a written complaint with the Principal with five (5) days of the initial concern. Within five (5) days, the principal is to render a decision concerning the complaint.

Formal

A person with a complaint about the Title 1 Program and/or its implementation in the district should file a written complaint with the Principal with five (5) days of the initial concern. The principal will schedule a hearing within five (5) days from the receipt of the complaint.

In the event that the complainant is not satisfied with the disposition of the complaint or if no decision has been rendered, the complainant may appeal to:

The portion of the meeting that pertains to the complaint shall be a closed meeting if requested. Minutes of the closed meeting shall be kept and a copy afforded to the complaint.

If the complainant is not satisfied with the decision of New Vision Learning Academy Board of Directors, he/she may file a complaint in accordance with the state and federal regulations, a parent may file a complaint in accordance with *The Louisiana Handbook for School Administrators*. Parents may also request a copy of this bulletin by calling the Department's toll-free number 1-877-453- 2721. (ESEA).
